

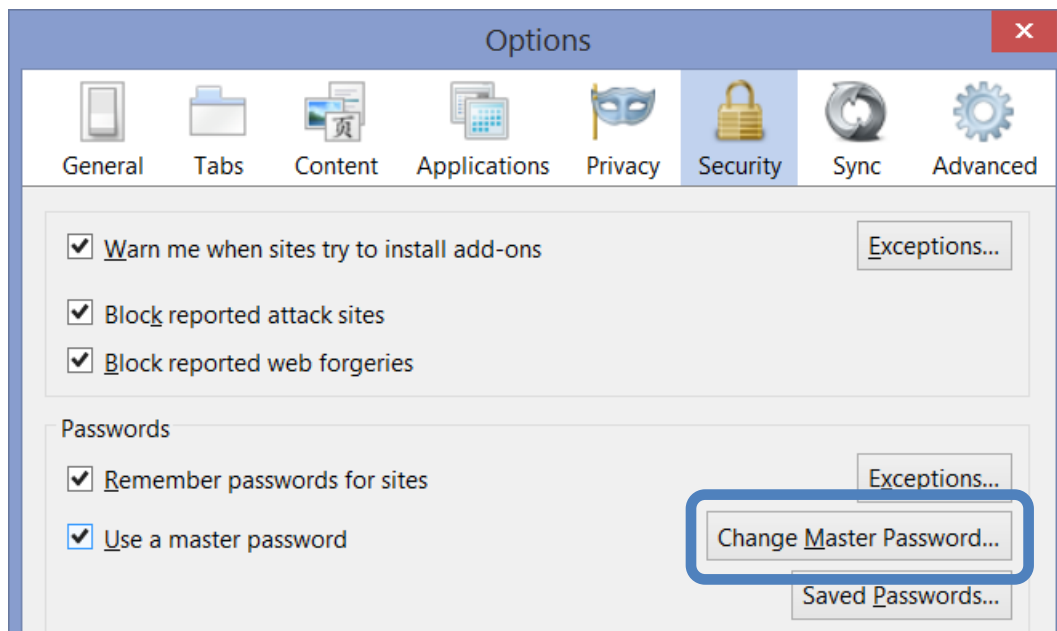


How do I change my Firefox master password?

Changing your master password in Firefox is simple! Follow these steps:

1. Click the menu button  and then click Options .
2. Select the Security panel, then click on the button that says “Change Master Password”.

3. A dialog box named “Change Master Password” will appear. Type your current master password in the first space provided, and then type your new password in the second and third spaces.

Note: The password quality meter is a guideline to help you choose a password. Filling the entire bar is helpful, but not a requirement. We suggest the password contain a combination of letters, numbers, and symbols. Make it complex enough that it will be difficult for others to guess, but simple enough that you’ll be able to remember it. ORC *cannot* reset this for you if you forget it!



Change Master Password

A Master Password is used to protect sensitive information like site passwords. If you create a Master Password you will be asked to enter it once per session when Firefox retrieves saved information protected by the password.


